Afterschool club

Firstly, a huge thank you to everyone who took the time to complete our childcare provision questionnaire. Your feedback has been so helpful, and we've tried to really listen to what you've told us about afterschool care and clubs.

Here's what we're planning, starting this Monday 15th September:

Childcare Provision - Mondays & Tuesdays

We know how important reliable afterschool care is for many families, so we're delighted to offer this new provision.

- When: Straight after school until 5:00pm
- Where: In the School Hall children can be collected from the main school entrance
- What's included: A variety of fun activities to keep children busy, plus a snack.
- Who Pupils from Rec Y6
- Cost: £7 per child / £5 per sibling (e.g. if you have 2 children attending, it's £5 each)
- Booking: Please book by 12pm on the day so we can plan ahead
- Flexibility: You can book for as many weeks as you'd like in one go, so you don't need to remember each week.
- Cancellations: If you need to cancel, please let us know at least 24 hours in advance later cancellations will still be charged.



We'll be running this as a **trial until October half term** and, if it works well for families, we'll look at adding more days.

Extra-Curricular Clubs - Wednesdays & Thursdays

Normal afterschool clubs will continue on these days.

Wednesday - Expressive Arts club with Miss Pitson (We are hoping that the pupils who attend this club will have the opportunity to perform at the Grand Theatre Swansea as part of the Primary Partners show.) Rec - Y6

Wednesday - Lego Club with Mrs Latham Rec - Y6

Thursday - Rugby club with Mark Bandalli and Fall Bay coaches. We are excited to be working with Fall Bay Rugby club to bring rugby coaching to our school. This club will be starting later this term, and we will share updates with you as soon as it is ready to begin.

- When: Straight after school until 4:30pm
- Where: classrooms children can be collected from the main school entrance.
- Cost £2.50 donation.
- How to book: Please use iPay.
- Booking deadline: Bookings need to be made by 12pm on the day
- Flexibility: You can block-book for several weeks in advance if that's easier for you.
- Cancellations: If you need to cancel, please let us know at least 24 hours in advance later cancellations will still be charged.

Friday Lunchtime - Choir with Mrs Smith Y2 - Y6 Children are welcome to join on the day if they'd like to take part. This year, we're excited to grow our choir and hope to perform in the local community, sharing our singing with others!

We hope these plans give you more options and help make afterschool a little easier. Most importantly, we're excited to offer children a safe, happy place to spend their afternoons with us.

Friday Enrichment

We would like to let you know about some upcoming changes to our **Friday Enrichment Programme**. After reviewing our current provision, we felt that it could offer even more variety and inspiration for our children.


Starting this term, we will introduce a **new timetable each term** that allows all children from **Year 1 to Year 6** to take part in a wide range of enriching experiences.

Here's how it will work:

- The children will be split into **four mixed-age groups** (Years 1-6 together)
- Each group will take part in a different enrichment activity each week
- Over the course of the half term, every child will experience all four activities
- Children can still wear non-uniform on Fridays to make the day feel special and practical for the activities they'll be taking part in

Our four enrichment activities this term are:

- Gower Explorers children will head out on the minibus for enriching adventures, such as exploring the beaches or local area.
- Science & Tech hands-on investigations and exciting experiments to spark curiosity



- Art & Design opportunities to get creative, from pottery to sculpture and beyond
- Music composing music, writing lyrics, creating videos, and sharing performances

At the end of each half term, we will review the activities and create a **new timetable**, giving children fresh opportunities to explore and learn in different ways.

We are looking forward to seeing the children collaborate, develop new skills, and discover their interests through this refreshed approach to enrichment.

Thank you, as always, for your support as we continue to develop and improve the opportunities we offer our pupils.
