Year 3/4 pupils also had a special experience as they set off on a walk along part of the Gower Pilgrimage Way with Vicar Peter. The children walked the section from St Andrews Church in Oxwich all the way to St Georges Church Reynoldston. It was a beautiful morning, and the children thoroughly enjoyed learning more about the rich history and significance of the landmarks right on their doorstep.



Our younger pupils joined the pilgrimage on a shorter route, walking from Llandewi Church to Henllys. They had a wonderful time and were even treated to squash and biscuits, kindly provided by Vicar Peter.

A huge thank you to Vicar Peter for his time, knowledge, and enthusiasm. His involvement has really helped bring our learning about the local area and its spiritual heritage to life.

In other news, Mrs Osborn has made the decision to move to part-time working from September and will be with us for three days a week. Although we're sad not to have Mrs Osborn full-time, this change also brings an exciting opportunity for the school. Over the past few months, we've been working hard to find the right person to work alongside Mr Osborn, and we're delighted to welcome Miss Saran Pitson to the Knelston team.

Sports Day



We know that many of you may have been disappointed this week by the news that Sports Day has been rescheduled. Please be assured that the decision to postpone the event was not taken lightly.

While I don't feel we need to, or should, justify every decision we make as a school, on this occasion I thought it would be helpful to share a little context with you.

We aimed to give at least 24 hours' notice to allow families time to adjust any plans, while also giving the weather every chance to improve. Living in Wales, we all know how quickly conditions can change, but when it comes to an event like Sports Day, there are several factors we must take into account—beyond just the weather at the time.

As a school, we have a responsibility to prioritise safeguarding and health and safety. Sports Day is meant to be a fun, exciting day for the children and their families, and the last thing we want is for anyone to get injured. Unfortunately, the heavy overnight and early morning rain on Thursday left the field absolutely soaked and unsafe for running or other activities.

Additionally, to support both convenience and safety, we usually open the bottom of the school field for parent parking, due to limited space around the school and to help with traffic flow. In the conditions we faced, this simply wasn't feasible. We do appreciate that rescheduling can cause inconvenience, especially as everyone's lives are busy. Being a parent myself, I fully understand how frustrating changes can be, and I want to thank you sincerely for your patience and flexibility.

The new date for Sports Day will be **Thursday 3rd July**, and we very much hope to see you there. Fingers crossed for sunshine!
